THE PASTOR'S PAGE

I am writing this after the Halloween party in my office and trying to focus on the end of the year. Yes, it is that time - time to focus on the end of a year.

The church year ends on November 21st.

Few of you know that when I write a sermon, I begin in the upper left hand corner with the church year in which it has been written. Then I



have next to it the Sunday in the church year. So for today, October 31st 2010 the upper right hand corner is: 09-10 #49. On November 28th, the first Sunday in Advent, I will have 10-11 #1 there. I don't exactly know why I do that, I guess it is one way to attempt to organize a very important part of my life - a tool to structure my life experiences.

When I was a child I had more of a sense of wonder about life – I trusted the environments and allowed the days to flow with me, not really feeling a need to mark the days and years in such a structured fashion, but now I appreciate the structures of the church year – marking out clearly for me passages that we all can experience together – like the end of a church year and the beginning of another. For what is truly different about living a spiritual life as a human being and doing so as a part of a specific congregation, is the community.

Practically every Sunday morning between 7 and 8 AM on 88.5 WAMU radio I listen to Krista Tippet's show which was formerly called "Speaking of Faith" and is now called, simply, "Being". I don't know how wise it is for me to do that, because my sermons always feel inadequate to me after that, and I am

sometimes tempted to stand up and say, “everyone just go home and stream today’s radio program on the computer”. But listening to spiritual talks on the radio (regardless of how wonderful they are) can never replace what humans seeking time together with the holiest of holies, sharing the same sacred space together, have.

And on another note, some of you know I went to my 30th college reunion on the weekend of October 21st- 24th. On that Friday night I went to experience Smokey Robinson in concert, and had another revelation about church. There were many there, including me, who were singing along with him (thank goodness for loudspeakers that overpower your own voice). And at one point Smokey was talking about how this concert was all about us in the audience. And he made sure that we all knew he was sincere, not just saying that. He said something like, “We were here this afternoon rehearsing, and I can promise you, it wasn’t this good.” I knew exactly what he meant. The bodies of the fellow travelers’ the souls are intermingling in a way that transcends all that is done in the name of love.

This is the end of our first full church year together, and the beginning of a new one. I thank God every day for each and every one of you sharing this journey together. As a pastor, you give my life a dimension and quality that is beyond measurement – sharing the holiest of holies, marking the Sundays in ways that are incalculable – no numbers in the corners can express your presence and God’s power. There is no earthly structure that can contain our faith – and yet we small humans need a framework, and we give it what we can. So from this Pastor’s Corner today, I wish you all a blessed end of the year and new beginning in these next 2 months. Shalom.

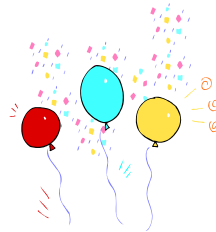

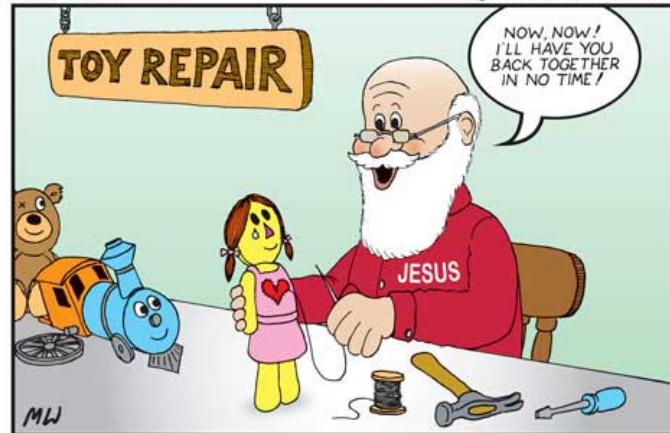
There are several books by Joseph Girzone in our library. I plan to read them all.

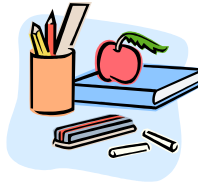

Covenant Theological Seminary's Worldwide Classroom Distance Learning Program

Early this year I discovered what has proven for me to be a very valuable educational resource for personal development as a child of God and as one involved in various ministries of our congregation. That resource is the Worldwide Classroom program of Covenant Theological Seminary, the national seminary of the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA).

Worldwide Classroom is a ministry of the seminary which is intended to help equip God's people for the various ministries to which they may be called. It is a distance learning program that allows one access to the complete lecture series of over twenty master's degree level courses which have been taught at Covenant Theological Seminary. You get to hear the entire course as it was taught to seminarians during a previous semester. This is a particularly nice service for people who would like to be better educated to serve in church leadership positions and various lay ministries, but whose work and family schedules won't accommodate formally attending seminary. Program offerings include, among others: courses on theology, church history, preaching, family counseling, missionary service, Christian ethics, and the Old and New Testaments.

One can listen to the lectures free of charge by downloading MP3 files from the program's website or by purchasing lecture series sets on CD through the seminary's book store. I personally have made a practice of purchasing the CD series so that I can listen to the lectures in my car during my long commutes to and from work. So far I have found each lecture to average about one hour in length and there are usually about 20 CDs in each series.

Along with the lectures, the Worldwide Classroom program also provides a list of textbooks that students at the seminary were required to read when taking the courses offered, so those participating in the distance learning experience can buy and read those as well. One can also download and print complete transcripts of all course lectures, as well as course study guides, without charge.

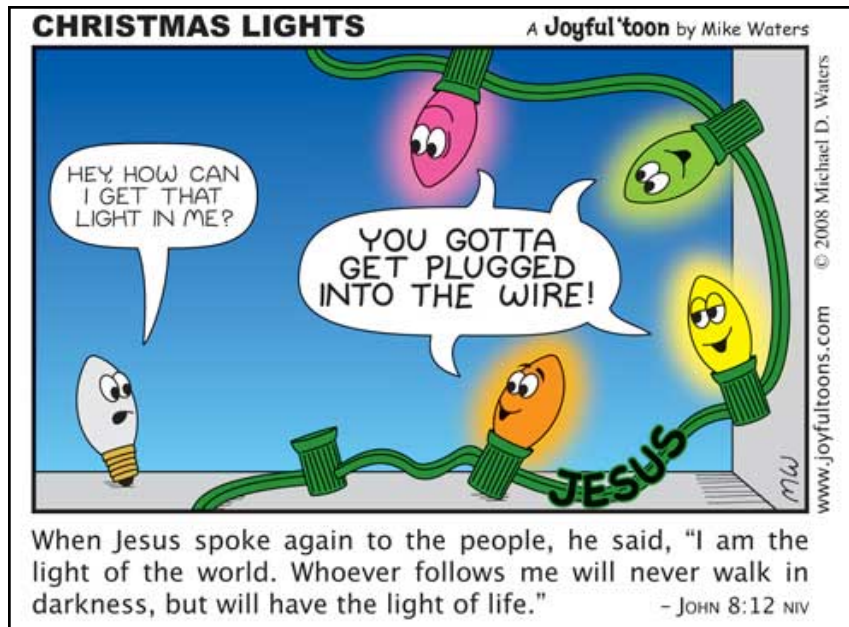
The only things missing in the educational experience are personal interaction with professors and students, examinations, written assignments, and college credit. If one wishes these, they would need to enroll in the seminary as a student. Still, I have found the learning experience offered by the Worldwide Classroom program to be very enlightening and fulfilling. I also now have an idea of what attending seminary would be like.

Covenant Theological Seminary allows Worldwide Classroom course materials to be used, copied, and distributed, as part of the ministry, providing such is not done for profit. Therefore, I have placed one course lecture CD series that I completed, "Youth Ministry," by Professor Mark Davis, in our church library for

use by others.

If you are interested in checking out the complete Worldwide Classroom program, I invite you to link to <http://worldwide-classroom.com/>. I think you will be impressed with what you find.
